ABSTRACT

Biologically, a child is a human being between the stages of birth and puberty. The legal definition of child generally refers to a minor, otherwise known as a person younger than the majority. In the present study a survey was conducted to compare health and nutritional status between Hindu and Muslim Children. The survey was carried out at Bhagwanpur-II block area, Purba Medinipur, West Bengal. The data was collected from Hindu Children (n=15) and Muslim Children (n=15). The survey was found that different measurements like height, weight, Gomez value, MUAC, Head and Chest Circumference were carried out. The participants were asked about their hygienic condition and diseases. It was found that there was significant (p>0.05) differences in Gomez value, MUAC, Head and Chest circumference between Hindu and Muslim Children. From the survey it was found that under weight, Dental caries are higher in Hindu Children than Muslim Children. And both are slightly suffering from poor immune function. It was found that more percentage of Hindu Children's hygiene is proper maintained from washing of hands after toile and before beating compare to Muslim Children.
