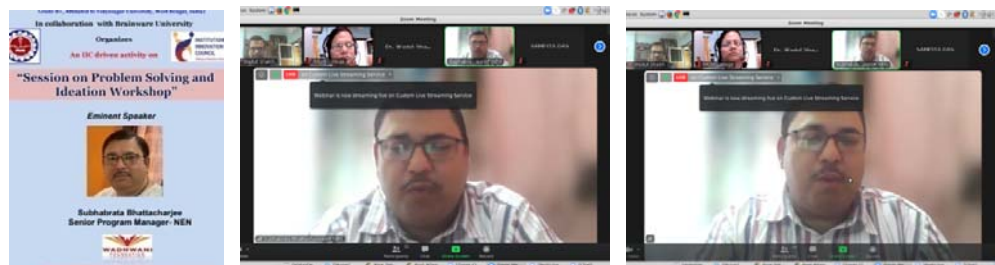
2. My Story – Motivational Session by successful Innovator Dated 23.02.2022

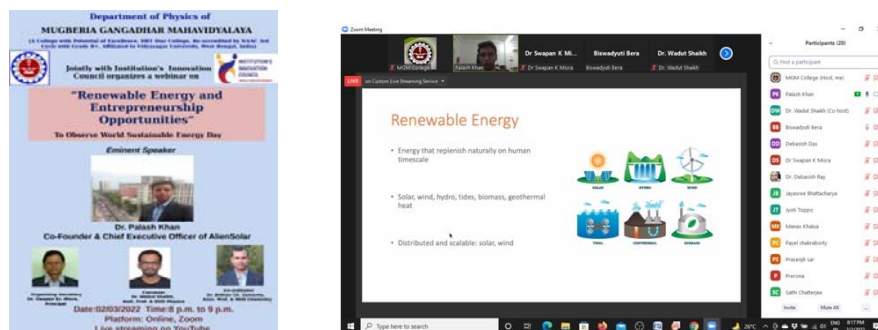
3. Session on Problem Solving and Ideation Workshop Dated 19.02.2022

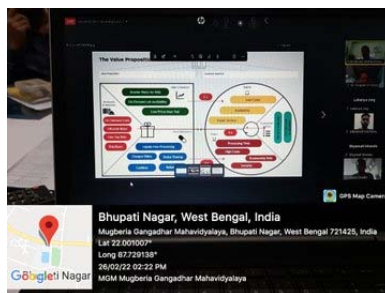

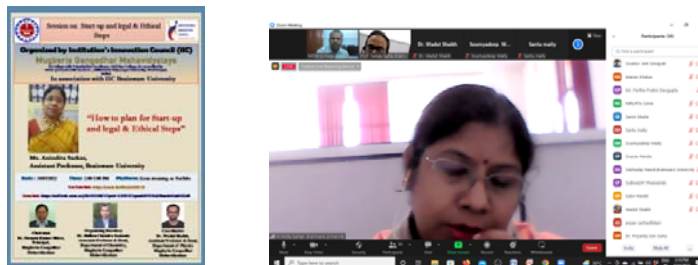
10. Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) and IP management for start up

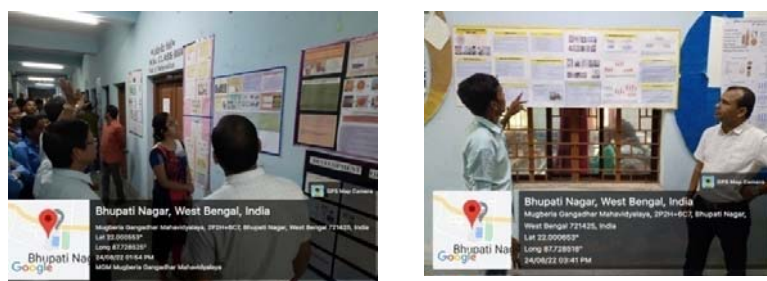
13. Workshop on “Business Model Canvas (BMC)” (Quarter III) dated 27.07.2022

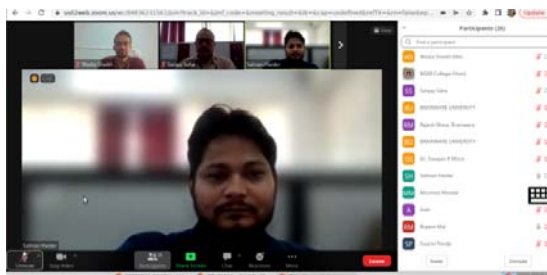

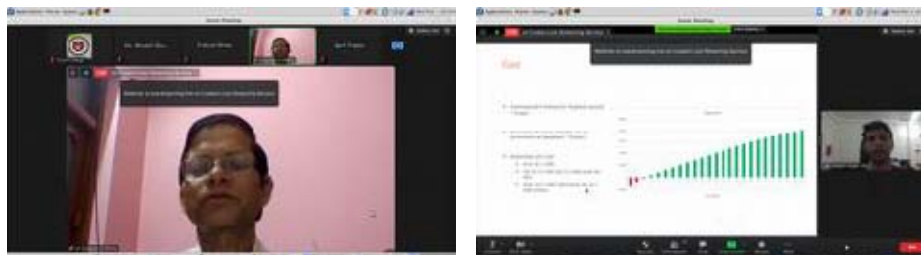
17. One-Day workshop on ‘Lean Start-up & Minimum Viable Product/Business’ (Quarter IV) dated 26.08.2022

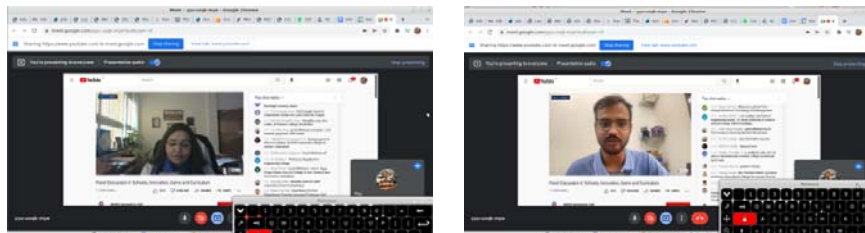
2. E-Symposium on Building Innovation Ecosystem in Educational Institutions- Day 1 (11th Jan 2022) (Quarter II)

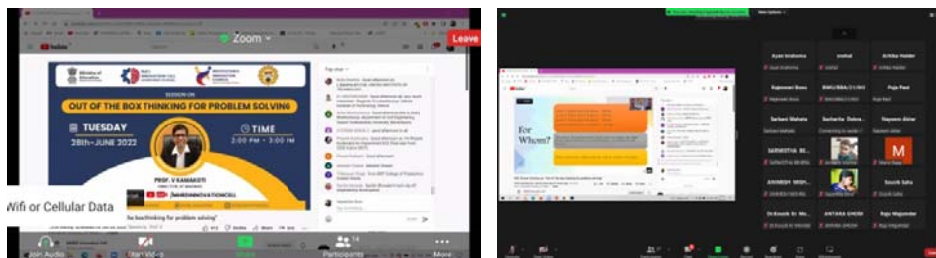
7. Participation in IIC Regional Meet, held at Gurunanak Institute of Technology, Kolkata (Quarter IV) dated 02/08/2022

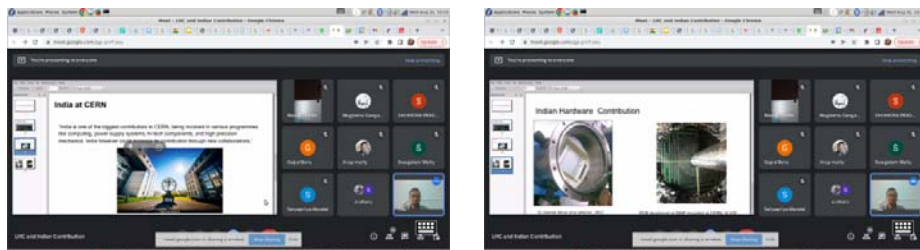
2. National Science Day (Quarter II)

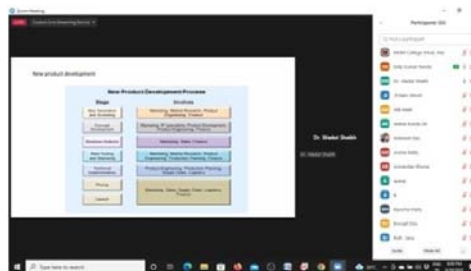
1. Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) and IP management for start up

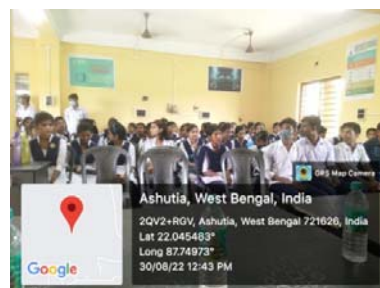


