## *History of the college*

The college is situated in a culturally rich locale, and it is the only college in the vast area of Bhagwanpur-II block. It was founded with the help of the donations collected from the local people with the aim to serve the poor inhabitants of the area who were unable to send their wards to distant places for higher education. It is noteworthy that some eminent people, enthusiasts in education and social work, took the initiative in establishing this college. Notable among them are Shri Jyotirmay Nanda, Shri Hrishikesh Gayen, Shri Rammay Nanda, Shri Biswanath Sarangi, Shri Tarapada Maity, Shri Sudhir Kumar Hazra, Shri Rakhal Chandra Sarangi, Shri Nanda Gopal Maity, Shri Bankim Chandra Hazra, Shri Ajit Kumar Paria, Shri Jogesh Chandra Nanda, Shri Jagattaran Tripathy, Shri Sachikanta Nanda, Shri Satish Chandra Manna, Shri Swadesh Gayen, Shri Surendranath Jana, Shri Sitanath Das, Shri Gunadhar Maity and Shri Banerwar Maity. The authorities were mainly dependent on the charity of the people for buying the required land and construction of buildings. The college greatly owes to Mugberia Gangadhar Trust for a donation of Rs. 15,345/-, and to late Shri Sailajacharan Nanda for giving away a house along with land where a suitable hostel has been constructed recently. Pandit Jyotirmay Nanda, B.A., 'Vedantakabyatirtha', 'Vidyabhusan' was in charge of the college as the secretary for six years from the commencement of the institution. His efficient administration enabled the college to begin its odyssey surmounting colossal difficulties.

The college is grateful to the famous psychiatrist Dr. Asit Baran Patra and his wife Prof. Gouri Patra for their donation of Rs.3 lakhs in memory of Shri Bhimacharan Patra for the construction of the Science Building. Shri Kiranmay Nanda, Hon'ble Minister of the Dept. of Fishery of the State Government who was the President of the College did his best in terms of monetary donations and physical efforts for the development of the college. Moreover, he had taken initiative for constructing an auditorium in memory of his father Shri Jyotirmay Nanda. Again, the college had received Rs.5 lakhs from the Government of Uttar Pradesh under Shri Mulayam Singh Yadav through his endeavour. The boundaries of the campus was constructed with the help of his fund and co-operation of the local people.

A magnificent gate was constructed at the entrance of the college with the financial aid from the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as the students of the college. Several beautiful gardens were constructed to enhance the beauty of the premises at the initiative of NSS, NCC and the employees of the library. Dr. Nilabja Nayan Sarangi donated a substantial amount in memory of his mother Late Susama Devi and Smt. Jyotshna Sasmal of Contai town also donated a substantial amount in memory of her husband Late Aurovinda Sasmal. Apart from these major donations many well wishers have contributed towards the development of the college and still continue to do so. The college is grateful to Late Prof. Sudhir Giri, the former M.P., for contributing Rs.2 lakhs from his MPLAD fund. The former M.P. Shri Prasanta Pradhan had donated Rs.7.5 lakhs from his MPLAD fund for the construction of the 'Four Decade Memorial Building'. The Zilla Parishad had given away



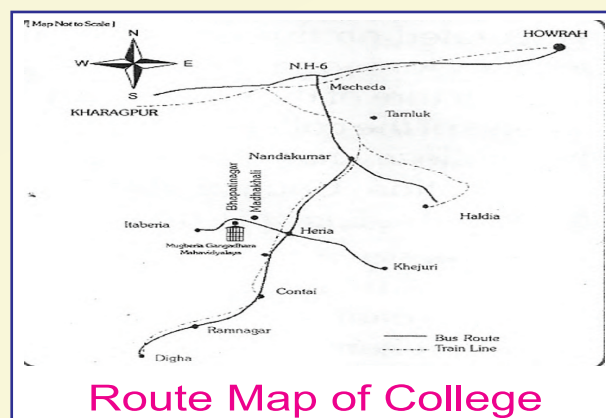

The UGC has contributed in many respects and has granted Rs. 70 lakhs for women's hostels. It is a pleasure to us that Bhagwanpur-II Panchyat Samiti generously provided us with a tube well and concrete path in the college campus. It is also a matter of excellence that in the year 2015, Rashtriya Uchotora Siksha Aviyan (RUSA) Contributed Rs. 2 crores for construction / Repairing work and equipment procurement. In the year 2016, inter alia, for promoting excellence in higher education, UGC has felicitated us with CPE, with the sum of Rs. 1.1 crore. Shri Ranajit Mondal, the former President of the college, was instrumental in arranging for a grant of 1.6 lakhs from the Zilla Parishad for developing toilet facilities in the college. It is also a pleasure to us that, the Govt. of WB, Education Department has sanctioned Rs. 1 Crore for the construction of Women Hostel in the year 2018. Mugberia Gangadhar High School had permitted the use of their rooms for the first four years since its inception and the college remains ever grateful to them.

In the year 2019, inter alia, for promoting excellence in higher education, DBT has felicitated us under DBT start college strengthening scheme, with the sum of Rs. 39 Lakhs for the academic development of Chemistry, Mathematics & Zoology of the college.

The festival marking the completion of four decades and the Golden Jubilee year of the establishment of the college had been celebrated with much enthusiasm. The Banerjee Maity Bijanan Bhavan and the Subarna Jayanti Bhavan have been inaugurated on these occasions.

## ***Location of the College***

The college is situated by the Heria - Itabaria Road, about 9 km from the Heria point of Mecheda - Digha Road / Heria Station of Tamluk - Digha Rail Link of South Eastern Railway (Digha is a famous sea-shore tourist spot. It is about 140 km from Kolkata, about 35 km from Contai sub-divisional town and about 50 km from the District Head Quarters of Tamluk. The college is well connected by bus and train.

## **Rules**

### **Regarding Online Admission System (OAS)**

The entire application process is to be conducted online and information regarding online admission is available on the college website at ([www.mugberiagangadharmahavidyalaya.org](http://www.mugberiagangadharmahavidyalaya.org)). Separate application is to be made for each subject. The students have to sign the identity card and the fee card in front of the concerned employee of the college during the time of admission. Student identity card will be distributed through Students' Union.

2. Admissions are made according to the norms to be determined by the Admission Sub-Committee following the criteria framed by the University.

The following papers to be uploaded during the time of online application :

- a) Admit Card of Madhyamik Pariksha or equivalent examination.
- b) Marksheet of Madhyamik Pariksha or equivalent examination.  
(for Accountancy & Economics Honours)
- c) Mark sheet of Higher Secondary or equivalent examination.
- d) One passport size coloured photograph.
- e) Character certificate from the institution last attended.
- f) Cast certificate, if applicable.
- g) University permission letter for students who have passed the H. S. Examination in the year 2015 or before.

### **Eligibility for Admission**

Students passing Higher Secondary or equivalent examinations in 2023, 2022 and 2021 can apply for different courses. Reservation of seats as per Government rules.



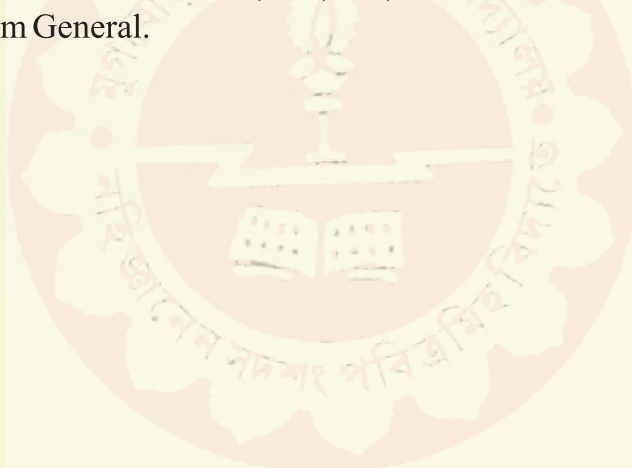

- ❖ Core Course (CC), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), Generic Elective(GE) courses are of 6 (six) credit each and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) & Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) are of 2 (two) credits each excluding Environmental Studies (ENVS) which is of 4 (four) credits.
- ❖ An undergraduate Degree with Honours in Arts /Science/ Commerce shall be awarded if a student completes 14 core courses/papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 4 courses/papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and 4 courses/papers from a list of Generic Elective(GE) papers, respectively.
- ❖ An undergraduate General Degree in Science shall be awarded if a student completes 12 core courses/papers (4 core papers each in three discipline of choice), 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses(AECC), 4 skill Enhancement Courses(SEC) and 2

papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers based on three discipline of choice selected above, respectively.

- ❖ An undergraduate General Degree in Arts/Commerce shall be awarded if a student completes 12 Core Courses (4 core papers each in two discipline of choice, 2 core papers each in English and MIL respectively), 2 Ability Enhancement compulsory Course (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers based on the two discipline of choice selected above respectively, and 2 papers from the Generic Elective (GE).
- ❖ For the purpose of computation of credits/work-load following mechanism shall be adopted:
  - i. Lecture 1 credit = 1 Hour Lecture [ 1 theory period of one hour duration per week]
  - ii. Tutorial 1 credit = 1 Hour Tutorial [1 tutorial period of one hour duration per week]
  - iii. Practical 1 credit = 2 Hours Practical [1 practical period of two hours duration per week]

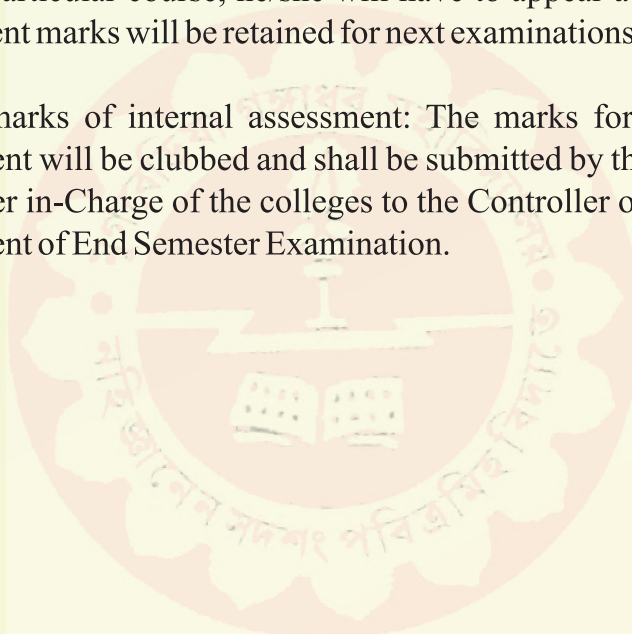
## ***Eligibility criteria of examination and types of assessment:***

- Each academic year shall have two Semesters. In each semester, there shall be two types of examinations: Internal Assessment (IA) and End Semester Examination (ESE).
- In the semester system, the examinations will be held in six parts. The academic session including the examinations for first, third and fifth semester are July to December and that for second, fourth and sixth semester are January to June. Before the End Semester Examination, a student will enjoy study leave of 10-12 days.
- A student must get himself/ herself admitted in each semester as per the admission rule
- A candidate shall be eligible for appearing at any of the semester of examination fulfilling the following essential conditions: a. A student must have at least 75% class attendance (theory and practical separately). b. Student must complete internal assessment.



## ***Continuous Internal Assessment***

- i. Process and marks distribution are as follows: All the internal continuous assessment will be conducted by the internal teacher of the respective Department. It shall be on the basis of tutorials, class tests, seminar presentations, or any combination thereof, evenly distributed over the entire study period. The modalities of such assessment be recorded and documents will be preserved by the respective college and those must be placed before any committee or team constituted by the university for verification, if needed.
- ii. Marks obtained in the internal assessment will be clubbed with marks obtained in the End Semester Examination before awarding the grade. If a candidate fails to secure pass grade in a particular course, he/she will have to appear at that course only. The internal assessment marks will be retained for next examinations with valid chances.
- iii. Submission of marks of internal assessment: The marks for class attendance and internal assessment will be clubbed and shall be submitted by the Principals/Teachers-in Charge/ Officer in-Charge of the colleges to the Controller of Examinations before the commencement of End Semester Examination.



## Payment of Fees

1. Tuition Fees are to be paid by the last date of every month.
2. If a student defaults in paying tuition fees for three consecutive months, his/her name will be struck off the attendance registrar. If such student is to take admission again he/she has to apply to the Principal citing the cause of such non-payment, and he/she has to pay all dues. However, he/she will not be awarded any attendance for the defaulting period.
3. Students have to pay their dues for the academic year by the time to be announced by the college.
4. Payment of any fee is to be made through fee card.

## Caution Deposit Refund

50% of all caution deposits are refundable. These refunds would be payable within two years of ending of the course. However, the students have to pay their dues to the college before claiming such refund. The refundable amount will be forfeited if not claimed within the stipulated period. The application claiming such refunds must be accompanied with the receipt of payment of dues / fee card. The deposits will be refunded on all working days, excepting Saturdays, in the months of November & December of every year.

## Information about different wings/facilities of the college

### Library :

The library is a focal point for anyone embarking UG and PG courses at this Institution. Apart from departmental libraries, there is a central library contains a stock of more than 30,000 volumes of books. Online access is available for a few digitized books through college website only. To support the onsite provisions of e-books and e-journals the Central



library subscribes to a number of internet services providing either full text or bibliographic access to journal literature in all major discipline. For example, our library is associated with UGC nlist-inflibnet resources which help our faculties and students to get updated with various journal articles. It is also preparing to be a member of the book club offered by the ICHR for online remote access portal of ICHR eResources. Presently the institute is adopting the learner centric education system by offering various types of learning resources. The Library is a large, well equipped two storied building with ample computers and reading rooms for teachers and students. Internal and external students can access the library with ease. Our library uses SOUL 2.0 software to function. Services offered by the library including lending service, reference service, reprographic service, display of new arrivals (Books and Journals), display of news papers and journals, display of materials related to career advancement of the students. Library database search is done through OPAC & WEBOPAC.

### Research Cell

The Research Cell of Mugberia Gangadhar Mahavidyalaya was formed on May 2012 and reformed in the year of 2015. Our students have participated and won prizes at national and international level conferences with their poster presentations.

In the academic session of 2022-23, the Research Cell has organized Acharya Prafulla Chandra Memorial lecture on his birthday, National Science Day observation, UGC-



Community outreach programme on “Vermicompost”, felicitation programme for the faculty members obtained M.Phil and Ph.D degree. It has also taken initiatives to publish the first issue of multi-disciplinary ISSN research journal entitled “Journal of Today's Science”.

### Department of Education

## Department of Philosophy

The Dept. of Philosophy started its journey from the very inception of this college in the year 1964 under the university of Calcutta. Renowned Prof Late Baneswar Maity, the pioneer of this Institution, was the inaugurator of this Dept. Some 3-4 years later Prof Late Mukti Roy joined the Dept. The popularity of those the then Professors were high among students, teachers and general people. After the retirement of Baneswar Babu Prof Kamal Kanti Biswas in the year 1993 stepped into this college and Dr Subhas Chandra joined the Dept in 1999 in the place of Prof Mukti Roy.

About 37 years later the Dept got the permission of Hons course under the Vidyasagar University. Now the Dept has four teaching staff, namely, Dr Subhas Chandra, (Associate Professor) Dr. Alak Ranjan Khatua, (Assistant Professor) and two Govt. approved SACT teachers Sri Sandipan Jana and Smt. Roma Das Sasmal. The Dept is on the way of progress and prosperity in the remote corner of the locality and trying its best to fulfill the needs of the students.



## Department of History

The department of history of MGM started since the very inception of the college in 1964. It was started as a general subject and later on upgraded with Honours. At present there are five faculties including 1 Associate Professor, 2 Assistant Professors and 2 govt. approved full time teachers. The syllabus of history was designed to provide advance understanding of the different aspects of the historical past across the world and to a great extent it leads the students to reconstruct the variant past. After graduation, the students can opt for various masters' programmes including Two years masters in History, Islamic History and Culture,

## Department of Nutrition

Nutrition science is the area of knowledge regarding the role of food in maintenance of health. This discipline is gradually gaining importance in terms of knowledge as well as career based prospect. The career opportunities of this discipline are in government hospitals, government's health department, schools, colleges, factories and office cafeterias, sports and health clubs gyms, teaching, research and



development, mass media, or as a private consultant/ practitioner. In our college the General course and Honours course in Nutrition Dept. started on 01.06.2006 and 29.07.2013, respectively. At present the department is running by one Assistant Professor, 6 SACT Teachers and one Laboratory Attendant. The department consists of departmental staff room, 2 theory class rooms, 1 smart class room, 1 laboratory and 1 departmental library. The laboratory consists of 4 desktops connected with high speed internet and 2 laptops, sufficient glassware and chemicals and necessary laboratory instruments. Beside theory and practical classes, project work, internship, academic excursion, assignment, presentation, etc. are also included in the course curriculum.

## Department of Political Science



The department of political science is one of the oldest departments of our college. The General course in Political Science commenced on 10.07.1964 and the Honours course saw the light of day on 12.08.1970 in our college. Since then distinguished teachers have been part of the department. The department has three full time professors who teach at the department for an extensive period. The

academic condition in terms of quality of faculty and learning transfer process is healthy and adequate. Department has smart class rooms, general class room for theory classes and computer with internet facilities which give most modern way of teaching. The important study areas of this subject are political thoughts, political theory, comparative politics, electoral systems and voting theory, international relation, public administration, game theory.

## Department of Mathematics (UG & PG)



Mathematics is a multifaceted subject of great beauty and application. Department of Mathematics was introduced as a general subject on and from 19.11.1997. After five years, on 16.08.2002 Mathematics Honours course was also commenced. M.Sc in Mathematics was started from 2017. This department has eight teachers including two permanent teachers, one contractual whole time teacher and five guest teachers. The department is also proud to offer engaged faculty who are dedicated to the success of all students by organizing seminars, workshops, special lectures, group discussions, tutorials, departmental quiz and wall magazine. These programmes enriched our students to make good relationships between mathematics and other fields of knowledge. It also helps them to learn the methods of research in mathematics. The teaching concentration of our department is designed to help our students to fulfill their requirements. Department has smart classrooms with all the modern facilities which will help students in modern science based study.



## Department of Physiology

B.Sc Physiology General course introduced on 9th July 2009. The department has a well equipped laboratory with necessary apparatus for overall development of the students and faculties. There are at present 02 SACT teachers and 01 lab assistant.





## Department of Physical Education (B.P.Ed & M.P.Ed)

The department established in 2002 with 50 student of B.P.Ed. , later seats increased with 15 and obtained NCTE recognition in 2006 with 50 seats. In 2014 the M.P.Ed. is started with 40 seats. About 75% of B.P.Ed. students absorbed in cssc, Primary teacher cadet and other govt jobs. A good no of B.P.Ed. passed students completed M.P.Ed. and a few qualified the NET. Different eminent personalities from the field of Physical education & sports and allied sciences have visited the department in different occasions such as Seminar,



Athletic Meet etc. The department has already organised 5(five) national level seminars on physical education and 1 (one) International seminar in 2018, 4 (four) Inter college sports & games meet and arranged ISAK accreditation course five times (level 1 & 2), One WBCIPE Meet where the total participants exceeded one thousand. At present the department have eleven teachers. The department publishes a research Journal with ISSN regularly and also organises an invitation football championship every year. Apart from that the students interact with society through Annual camp, Picnic, Tour, internship and teaching practice in different school of the surroundings.

## Department of Physical Education

Physical education department is one of the eminent departments of the college. The department has been working for the students upholding the ideals of Swami Vivekananda since the very beginning. The college provides all the necessary equipments for general developments of the departments. As because of the departmental activities are mainly focused upon sport and physical fitness, the students have the



opportunity to learn obedience, self control, ethics, morality, open mindness, and the flexibility of taking quick decisions. The institution is the great illustration of national integration and globalization of sports which is the main motto of the department.





## Department of Commerce

The Department had its inception in 1985 with the introduction of the B.Com [General] degree programme and the Honours course saw the light of day in the year 1996. The course intends to provide a foundation for students who plan to pursue their career in business, commerce, accounting, tax etc.

The faculty of commerce specialized in varied aspects of Commerce and Management - in areas like Accounting, Finance, Marketing, Taxation and Corporate & Business Law etc. At present the department is enriched by one full time faculty member, three Govt. Approved SACT Teachers and two contractual Assistant Professors.

Commerce department provides an enabling environment to help its students stand out in terms of the college's vision and today's competitive environment. In order to keep pace with recent trends, two Carrier Oriented Programmes [COP] were also made part of the curriculum with the help of UGC, namely i) COP in Business Management, ii) COP in Income Tax & GST.

With all these inputs one finds our students hardworking, practical-oriented and effective in any work environment.



## Department of Geography

The Department of Geography of Mugberia Gangadhar Mahavidyalaya aims at empowering students with knowledge and skills for spatial awareness and temporal challenges. The Department has been relentlessly progressing towards excellence since its inception with an aim to prepare the students to navigate through real world problems. Awareness and knowledge are the key to excel in future, so, the Department takes up the students as to prepare them to have excellent command over situation and making them a responsible and aware citizen in near future. The department has good laboratory, library and other infra-structural set up that assists the students to ensemble the knowledge taught. Also, field tour, excursion, and other



departmental activities are arranged annually that help the students to prosper not only in academics, but also in other arenas of life. ## Department of Music

It is offering 3 yrs Honours & Pass course under CBCS. At present there is 02 whole time faculty with 03 Govt. Approved Part-Time teachers and one accompanist.

## Department of Sanskrit

The Department of Sanskrit was with the vision of preservation and enrichment of oriental learning, culture, philosophy and thought by virtue of deep studies and research of the both Vedic and Classical Sanskrit Literature. It includes teaching of traditional Sanskrit Texts covering various domains like the Vedas. Indian Philosophy, Sanskrit grammar and Linguistics, Classical Sanskrit to focus on the thoughts of the both oriental and occidental thinkers to make this globe a place of happiness and co-existence. There are at present two whole time teachers and two Govt. approved part-time teachers. It is offering 3 yrs Honours & Pass course under CBCS.





## Department of English

Year of Inception Honours-08.08.1996

English Department is one of the prestigious departments of our college containing seven faculties. This department is the most popular choice among students seeking admission in honours. Its reputation rests on the accomplishments of its graduates, the generosity of its professors and a curriculum that creates a beautiful symbiosis between study of different genres of English Literature and creative writing. Our alumni have distinguished themselves in all walks of life- Civil Service, Academics, Ecclesiastics, and Public life. Department is equipped with all modern facilities including smart class rooms with computers, power point presentation facilities, microphones, sound system, etc. which will help students to grab modern literatures.



## Department of Botany



Department of Botany started as General course in 2009. Botany can be opted as an elective subject with Zoology (H), Nutrition (H) and other subjects also. Botany department has well-equipped laboratory, one smart class room with computers and internet facilities (Wi-Fi Zone for students) are also available. A departmental library with over 100 books offers the students to easy prepare the study materials. This department arranges regular class test, internal assessment and educational excursion and publish wall magazine regularly. Total teaching stuffs are two including one full time teacher and one govt. approved part-time teacher.

## Department of Zoology

Zoology is one of the attractive and interesting branches of Biological Sciences that deals with amazing and spectacular animal world. Understanding the merits of teaching, the subject in rural area has high scope to come in touch with nature. Field trips are conducted every year with utmost care to provide opportunity to students to come across natural ecosystem to understand the study system that creates real interest and clarifies subject matter. The department provides elective options for Zoology Hons. and General subjects. Department has four teaching staffs and one laboratory attendant. The department possesses a well equipped laboratory with preserved specimens containing museum, smart class rooms, departmental and central library containing necessary text books.





## Department of Physics



The department of Physics is committed to engage in high quality research and pursuit of excellence in teaching. Teachers of the department are actively involved in research in frontier areas of both pure and applied Physics, and interdisciplinary areas of science & technology. It has a well equipped laboratory with all modern equipments. The department has received one Major Research Project from UGC few years back. The department has presently five Part-time teachers.

## Department of Chemistry



The department started its journey as General Stream in 1997 and it was upgraded to Honours level from 2002. The total departmental area is covered by five rooms among which one is particularly ICT enabled classroom, one is particularly laboratory equipped with storage of chemicals, one is laboratory cum classroom, one is departmental staff room and the rest room is for research lab. At present we are now six teachers in the department and two permanent Lab attendants. The department is committed to deliver quality teaching to the students by providing proper infrastructure, interactive classroom activities, seminars, invited lectures, hands on practical training, project work, educational tour, summer training and carrier oriented productive guidance



for higher studies, competitive exam etc. The objective of the department is to stimulate an urge for knowledge and enlightenment in the students so that they can find out the path to attain success and built up a personality with intellectually competent, morality and social commitment.

## Department of Bengali (UG & PG)



The Mugberia Gangadhar Mahavidyalaya established in 1964, with offered Bengali (General) and some few General Courses. After eight years it becomes Honours in Bengali (1972). The Department of Bengali has been an integral part of College. This Department had a humble beginning with only a few students pursuing studies in Bengali literature, today the Department is proud of catering to the growing needs of students to study PG in Bengali, Honours and General in Bengali literature.

Bengali department has five faculties who are very efficient to take classes with all modern facilities like ICT enabled classrooms, sound and mike systems. The University of Vidyasagar offered special education of Folk Culture under this major Department. Our final year students can realize the interpretation of folklore study's to taking an individual project by the observation of very experienced teacher. The Department of Bengali with all its dignity prepared the ground for this dream since its inception in 1964.



## Department of Economics

The Department of Economics offers a three year B.SC. (Hons) degree under CBCS. The aim of the programme is to equip students with quantitative tools as well as strong logical reasoning ability such that students are able to understand the role of economics in everyday decision making as well as the impact of alternative public policies on inequality and welfare. At present there are three Govt. Approved part-time teachers.

## B.Voc in Food Processing



Food processing is the branch of food science where students can gather their knowledge of transformation of agricultural products into prepared food. Food processing includes various methods, process, preservation, packaging, storage and marketing of various convenience foods. B.Voc in Food Processing have several career opportunity in various job in various domain such as food industry, manufacturing firms, mills, quality control organizations, restaurants, packaging industries, food research labs, schools, colleges, airport etc as a production manager, executive officer, scientist, research and devolvement, food safety officer etc.

In our college, B.voc in food processing started from 4th August 2018 under the Department of Nutrition. This course is running under Skill council (NSDC) of India and granted by UGC and affiliated by Vidyasagar University. In this Bachelor Degree course, several papers are taught like dairy, bakery, beverages, fish, meat & poultry processing, cereal & pulse processing, industrial safety and plant layout, waste management, food standard and laws and regulations, food packaging etc. Besides various classroom based theoretical knowledge several industry visits and industry training, internship, excursion, project works, practical classes also done by B.Voc Food Processing students. At present, the programme is running with 7 Assistant Professors, 12 SACT teachers, 2 guest lecturers and 1 lab attendant. The department consists of 2 staff rooms with 1 departmental library, 9 class rooms (including 5 smart class room) and 3 well equipped practical laboratories. Department have 12 desktops with high speed internet and 2 laptops. There are several instruments and equipments like UV VIS spectrophotometer, colorimeter, pH meter, B.O.D incubator, bacteriological incubator, hot air oven, vacuum pump, micro wave oven, water bath, reflux condenser, centrifuge, vortex mixture, weighing balance, magnetic stirrer with hot plate, micropipette, desiccators, hand blender, icebox, refrigerator, microscope, microscope automatic blood pressure measuring machine, sphygmomanometer, stethoscope, human weight machine, blood sugar measurement machine, haemoglobinometer, anthropometric rod, skin fold caliper, measuring tape. There is Training and Placement cell which conducts various visits, trainings and placement in different industry like Red Cow Dairy, AMUL, SOBISCO, Tasty Bakery, Pashupati aquatics, Bera Food Products, Keventer Agro Pvt Ltd., Mother Dairy, Fruits and Vegetable Product Pvt. Ltd, Dudhmansagar Dairy, Bina Bakery, Ma Tara Bakery, Jaya Bakery, Raja Bakery, Britannia, Star Milk etc.



## **M.Voc in Food Technology, Nutrition and Management**

M.Voc in Food Technology, Nutrition & Management is a two-year postgraduate program that provides advance theoretical and practical knowledge in food processing techniques, food safety and quality control, food packaging, and supply chain management and Nutrition. The course aims to bridge the gap between academia and



industry by emphasizing hands-on learning and industry-oriented projects. In our college, M.Voc in Food Technology, Nutrition & Management program is started in 1st December, 2020 under the Department of Nutrition. This course is running under Skill council (NSDC) of India and granted by UGC and affiliated by Vidyasagar University.

In this Master Degree course, several papers are taught like soft skill, computer basics, fundamentals and advances in food processing and packaging, bio-chemistry, diet chart preparation, software packages for statistical computing, sensory evaluation, food quality management, intellectual property, entrepreneurship, statistics and research methodology, and dissertation.

At present, programme is running with 6 Assistant Professors, 3 SACT teachers, 1 guest lecturer and 1 lab attendant. The department consists of 2 staff rooms with 1 departmental library, 9 class rooms (including 5 smart class room) and 3 well equipped practical laboratories. Department have 12 desktops with high speed internet and 2 laptops. 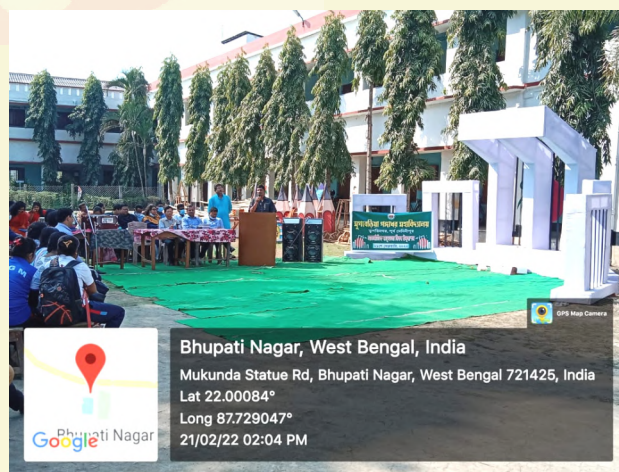
